

Session I (June 1-11): **Budgeting/Personal Finance**

What is the purpose of money and what is it used for? What are some things I want to buy? How much do those things cost? How will I be able to afford the things that I want to buy? How much are bills? How do my parents earn money? How can I earn money to afford what I want to buy? What is something that I would like to save money for? Is it a good idea to borrow money? How do credit cards work? What is interest? How do taxes work? What is an investment? What is a dividend? Come practice how money works in a real-life economic situation within the classroom!

Session II (June 14-25): Writing for Critical Thinking

What is critical thinking? How can I write to show critical thinking? How can I respond to reading passages in a thoughtful way? What does it mean to write with a purpose? How can I analyze a passage that seems too difficult to understand? What does it mean to justify my answers? How can I use the text in order to make my argument stronger? What is criticism? Can it be used to make something better? What is the difference between descriptive and analytical writing? What are the different stages of critical writing? How can I use critical writing in different ways? How can I use the RACE strategy to improve my writing skills? Dive into the world of critical writing in a fun and engaging way!

Session III (June 28-July 9): Faster, Higher, Stronger/Olympics

When and where did the ancient Olympic start? What was the purpose of the ancient Olympic Games? Why do the Olympic Games move host cities each time and how is the location decided? How often are the Olympic games held and how was that decision reached? Who are some famous athletes who participated in the Olympics? How do athletes qualify to compete in the Olympics? Are there advantages or disadvantages to the athletes depending on where the events are held? If you were to be an Olympian, what would you want to compete in and how could you make that dream a reality? How do you train to be an Olympian? If you could, what new category would you want to create for the Olympic Games? Let's have some fun practicing for the Olympic games!

Session IV (July 12-23): Myth, Folklore, Legend & Fairytale

What is a myth? What is folklore? What is a legend? What is a fairytale? What are the characteristics of myths, folklore, legend, and fairytale? What are the similarities and differences among myth, folklore, legend, and fairytale? Why are they popular? How can an author use these types of stories to teach a lesson? What are common themes throughout different cultures' myths and folklore? What are some famous myths, legends, fairy tales, and folklore? What are some famous mythical places and where did they come from? Is there a mythical place that you would want to visit or learn more about? What unique cultural traits are revealed in myths? What kinds of myths and folklore came from your family's country? Let's create our very own story!

Session V (July 26-August 6): Innovations in Artificial Intelligence

What is artificial intelligence? How was AI developed? What are the different types of AI? How does it work? What are some of the biggest technological changes from the last century? What about the last decade? What are the examples of artificial intelligence in use today? What industries have been affected the most by AI? How have those changes affected our day to day lives? How has AI benefited us? What are the possible risks of AI? What are these transformations driving towards? How has COVID accelerated those changes? What further transformations do we think will happen in the future? Let's have fun exploring AI and its possibilities!
